Highlights of the Rienzi Collection

Join Rienzi docents for an overview of life and luxury in the 18th and early 19th centuries. The Rienzi Collection features decorative arts and paintings that explore how people lived in the period. Perfect for world history classes! (WH 3, 26, 31)

The Eighteenth Century and the Ancient World: A Look at Mythology

Explore the ancient gods and goddesses of Mount Olympus through objects in Rienzi's collection. During the 18th century, the discovery of Pompeii spurred the creation of a visual culture inspired by ancient iconography and principles. Learn about the myths behind the images and their purpose in the Age of Enlightenment. (Eng I 2, 8) (WH 1, 3, 26)

East Meets West: Trade and Globalization in the Eighteenth Century

Travel to four continents by exploring the idea of globalization. Find out how new methods of sea and land transport opened trade between Asia, Europe, and the Americas, and look at works of art that were made in England, but inspired by China, Japan, and India. (WH 3, 7, 8, 31)

Women of the House: Roles of Eighteenth-Century Women

Explore the portraits of women in the Rienzi Collection. Learn about Mrs. Elisha Mathew; Lady Elizabeth Blunt; and Eleanor, Countess of Lauderdale; among others. The tour also investigates feminine wares produced for a female audience. (WH 3, 24)
